## The Higher the Point of Freedom

In the Basic Text, in the Chapter on the SYMBOL, it talks about "The wider the base the higher the point of freedom" It talks about it in terms of the base becoming wider due to the more people involved with the program. I am inclined to look at it from a different perspective.

I feel that the more information I have about how the Steps work in my life, the stronger my relationship becomes with my Higher Power, the better I become at accepting myself, THE HIGHER THE POINT OF FREEDOM.

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# Experience Strength & Hope Service YES

Early in my recovery, I was sitting in on a PI presentation and there was a need for a position to be filled. I had no intention of stepping up, but my Higher Power seemed to have other plans. When the question was asked if there were any willing addicts, a bounding and affirmative YES came out of my mouth. It was a few weeks after taking on that position that I started to understand it when I would hear, "We can only keep what we have by giving it away". It became clearer everyday. The more times I could help the still suffering addict, the more confidence in my own recovery I seemed to have. I built on that strength and made it a solid part of my recovery's foundation.

Since coming into the Fellowship of Narcotics Anonymous, service work has always been a priority in my recovery. Everything from opening a meeting, GSR, group secretary and service at the Area and Regional levels have helped me in one way or another to stay clean. By doing service work, it helps to keep me The primary purpose of carrying the message to the still suffering addict is very important. There were many addicts helping me in the beginning to understand that no matter what, I never had to use again. It was given so freely and without expectations to me, it is my responsibility as an addict to do the same in return.

Today, I understand and believe that this is a We program. Not a day goes by that I do not thank my Higher Power for putting service work in my life. I have met many wonderful addicts who have taught me how to build on my foundation and to help other addicts to build on theirs.

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#### FROM THE VAULTS

Here is a brief look at what the Northern New England Region was up to way back in September of 1993. We met in Wayne, Maine with 17 addicts present.

**From the RSR Report -** I would like to propose we have a regionally sponsored GSR Forum in the beginning of next year, (maybe Feb?). All the GSR's from our Area's could meet, work on the inventory, and CAR. For those of you who would like to see more unity and participation...I think this will work and maybe we could have a dance/fun evening for a fund raiser after the Forum.

**From the RSR-A Report -** My report will focus on the North East Zonal Forum meeting of July 31<sup>st</sup> at Clifton, N.J. Eight Regions participated. Connecticut, Greater New York, Mid Atlantic, New Jersey, No. New Jersey, New England, Tri-State(greater Pittsburg). The issues discussed were: Area Conventions and their effect on the Region, Incorporation and area convention committees, service committees, Phone-lines.

**From Hospitals and Institutions:** We had a meeting this morning with five addicts in attendance. Reports were read from: Central Maine, Granite State, WSC H&I External Affairs. Reports were missing from: Seacoast, Southern Maine and Northern Serenity.

From Activities: We met with 3 addicts in attendance. We discussed the NNER Anniversary set for next Saturday, September 25, 1993. It is suggested that we make local phone calls in our Area's to remind people that we need support for our annual fund raising event.

**From Public Information:** This sub committee met today with two Area's in attendance. Southern Maine and Granite State Area's were represented. They talked about traveling to the groups to do workshops for the phoneline. They are also discussing the possibility of airing another PSA on television in their Area.

**From Outreach:** We compiled a list of those sample guidelines. We are submitting our guidelines today. We are registering this committee with the WSC ad-hoc on Outreach.

**From Seacoast Area:** I did write a report asking for a response on the \$1600 reserve for this Region. No response was given. I heard some talk of an ad-hoc committee forming. This committee is to look into the Seacoast Area joining up with another Area. I do not have first hand knowledge of this subject so I can go no further.

From Central Area of Maine: Our Area is currently revising our guidelines and we are nearly finished. The biggest change has been in our decision-making and election process. We are hopeful that our new guidelines will help make Area Service meetings a more spiritual place.

**From Granite State Area:** Our policy committee has finished all our Area guidelines. Our campout was a great success, both financially and spiritually. We have an H&I-P.I. Professional Day, October 23 at the V.A. Hospital, and a Tradition and Concepts Learning Day on November 13th at the same place. We have a 40th anniversary on October 9 at Bow Lake.

From Southern Maine Area: Someone is going to contact the Northern Serenity Area of Maine to see what meetings are happening in this Area and then bring it back to this meeting. It is also requested that if there are meetings still happening to contact us so that the meetings can be put into the new meeting list.

**From Old Business:** An ad-hoc chair was appointed to look into a way to incorporate how funds our allocated to the RSR and RSR-A travel to the WSC.

**From New Business:** Motion 2: To financially and spiritually support the attendance of the RSR and RSR-A at the North East Zonal Forums. Twice a year the RSR and RSR-A will submit gas and toll receipts, not lodging or food. To be evaluated September of 1994.

Intent: To continue this dialogue with our neighboring Regions.

Motion passes by a vote of 6.
