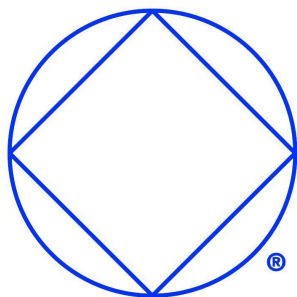

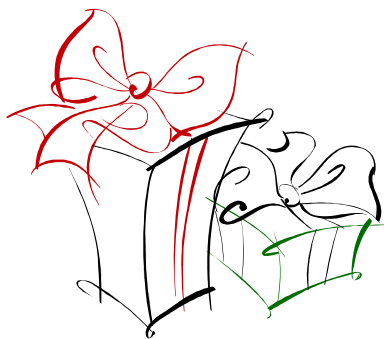
12 Gifts of NA, *continued*

The 7th Gift...

Through the literature, going to meetings, the fellowship and the first 6 Gifts...the gift of the Spiritual Principles were given to me. The sharing and giving and guidance of this new way of life turn from a "maybe" into a "hope and dream". I could start to recognize the new people in my life who had what I wanted, and what I did not want. I was shown and lived through living the process that no one on this journey should ever be labeled, put on a pedestal or kicked to the curb and left in the gutter. Unconditional love..... for everyone every time.

The 8th Gift...

Was the realization that I am not responsible for my disease but I am responsible for my recovery. What freedom to know that I have choices today. If I follow the program of recovery and apply it to all areas of my life things will change. Daily maintenance of the spiritual connection with my HP and to continue to write out the steps on a regular basis. New things continued to be revealed so long as I remain teachable.



The 9th Gift....

Gift of service to and through NA. I was told to find a Home Group or I was homeless. To get involved and be a part of, being

part of our family fellowship. I was told service could be suiting up and showing up to a meeting and sharing my experience, strength and hope. It could be many other "service positions" when I was ready and my HP agreed. It was also, the

gift of learning how to say "no". If I am so busy doing, helping and offering that my personal recovery is not a priority than I am burning all the gifts given to ashes.

The 10th Gift....

Happened when the other gifts were working in my life. An understanding that in order to keep it I must give it away. Hmmmm.....giving away a gift so that I may keep it? Just like a flowering plant that blooms, must be fed and watered and given light - I need to share my experience strength and hope to newcomers and old timers as well or my recovery will shrivel up and die. Always trying to remember that this is my experience strength and home not anyone else's and what may keep me clean may cause someone else to go back out. This means at meetings, posting at my homegroup, being willing to be a sponsor and many more things.

The 11th Gift....

Living a selfish but selfless program in my life. I am the only one who can live my life for me and make the choices I make. But if I want the easier softer way I will remain willing to listen to suggestions. Expanding my horizons and taking risks like online meetings, sponsorship, service work and communication through the internet and the telephone. Getting out into the "real" world and not switching my addiction from drugs in the black hole I was in – to only living my life in the rooms and service work. When my feelings get hurt I feel the pain today and make choices. When you cry we all cry, when you laugh we all laugh, and when you bloom we see the beauty.

The 12th Gift....

The gift of the ability to make choices and what they are today are too many to mention. The choices will be greatly reduced if I choose to pick up or not live in recovery for this addict. I choose to strive for being happy, joyous, free and serene. I choose to take back my voice, dreams and power that I gave away to anyone or anything depending on which way the wind was blowing. I believe this is what my HP

wants for me and everyone on this earth. The choices in life and living clean today does not just "happen" no matter what I believe or think or say. Life happens and hurt is a part of living just as love and happiness is. One of the gifts is the ability to choose who I want in my life today. The many friends and the love given and received are very very plentiful. I only choose to have people who are healthy and living in the light and spirit of positivity and spirituality. Or are willing to try a new way of life, jft. Yes, I am not perfect none of us is - but I choose to be in the solution today rather than the problem. It takes less effort to be unhappy and unspiritual than to be happy and spiritual. I choose life not death today.

Your Greatest Fear

Your greatest fear is exactly where your addiction was taking you.

To say that we lived fear-filled lives in our active addiction is probably an understatement. Our disease needed to be fed in order to survive, so it lied to us. It promised us happiness if we kept it nourished, and it came through on its threats of pain and sickness if we didn't meet its demands. That kind of misery, the fear of never having enough to satisfy our addiction, took us straight down a brimstone path into a hell of our own making.

Our disease didn't stop with our addiction alone. It created fear in many other areas of our lives as well. We feared for our personal relationships, our living situations, our jobs/careers and finances, our freedom and our future. We feared for our very lives. So we killed all of those fears by practicing our addiction, with our disease in control.

Then one day, for whatever reason, each of us discovered that we couldn't live our lives that way any longer. Still full of fear, we

attended our first meeting. For the first time in a long while (if ever) we found a place where we belong, and where we are accepted just as we are. We were welcomed by people we may have never met, and that scared us even more.

After a little time, the support from our friends in the Fellowship helped to ease our fears. They had what we desperately needed in our lives: hope. They told us what their lives were like, what they did to change, and how their lives are today. They shared their experience, and offered each of us the strength of their combined love. Most importantly, they gave us the gift of hope freely, just as freely as it was given to them.

Now, today, I don't have to live my life in fear. I can get the help I need from my friends in the program, through whom my Higher Power speaks. Over time, my fear will be replaced by faith that my life will get better each day. The God of my understanding will diminish the fear in my life through my working the 12-Steps, and with the help of my friends in the Fellowship.

Am I ready to let go of the fear that can ruin my life?

Giving it away

One of the first service principles I was taught in NA was “you gotta give it away to keep it.” For the past three years I have given it away on a group level. I have chaired, made coffee, welcomed newcomers and served as a GSR for a group.

It was slow going at first, but eventually we began to grow and so did my excitement! I was thrilled to actually have people at the meeting, I welcomed the problems that often come with a new meeting, and I was challenged like never before. Folks from another part of the state traveled to support our group. And as time went on, we were able to share the responsibility of the group with the newcomers, they were getting involved and chairing the meeting and making coffee. For the first time in a long time, the courts and other locals were referring folks to NA.

Then came the struggle, for our group, it was a lack of members with clean time. We had so many newcomers and so little old timers. As a group we needed sponsors, other addicts to talk to, and an atmosphere of recovery. I'm sad to say that we lacked all of the above. Addicts

were telling each other “it's ok to drink or smoke dope, as long as we aren't doing crystal meth we are clean”.

This misconception hurt many newcomers and also violated what NA is based on, “total



abstinence”. The meeting has now folded and that is very sad.

I know I can't do it alone! Perhaps one day someone will come along and my name will be passed along to them, perhaps another addict will move into the area and have a willingness to start an NA meeting. I just pray that my HP will send someone who wants to give it away to keep it. Meanwhile, I will attend my online meetings and will travel as time and weather permit to other face to face NA meetings. NA still lives, it still works in my life today and for that I am very grateful!

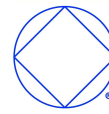
